Another Opinion.

ASTORIA, Dec. 6, 1881. EDITOR ASTORIAN: In a late issue of your paper a correspondent finds fault because there was no dragging upon the "bar" this year.

The channel through the "cut off," where the dragging was done the year before, corresponds by surveys of this summer to be nearly as deep as the outlet to the north channel, and considering the difference in the swell of the sea would float as deep a vessel as would go out the north channel which is the only channel now generally used.

They claimed that there would be no benefit obtained in dragging the "cut off" more, unless the north channel could also be deepened. To improve the latter would require much more money than was at the disposal of the engineers here.

As to the plan in the case, vessels have crossed through the "cut off" this fall when they were not able to go to sea across the bar of the north channel, showing that the ideas of the engineers were correct in that.

As to the division of the appropriation from Portland to the sea, it is to be inferred from the report of the chief of engineers, that it is made according to the plans and estimates made prior to the appropriation.
