According to a recent authority the total area of settlement in this country in 1880, exclusive of Alaska, was 1,569,570 square miles. The total population being 50,-155,783, the average number of inhabitants to the square mile of settled area was 32. These and other facts are furnished by a writer in the last number of the International Review. In the first decade, that is from 1790 to 1880, the increase of settled area was a little over 27 per cent. But this settlement had not then gone beyond the Alleghanics. In the decade from 1810 to 1820 the gain was 25 per cent. In the next decade it was only a fraction less. From 1830 to 1840 the gain was 27 per cent, and from 1840 to 1850 it was 21 per cent. In the decade from 1850 to 1860 200,000 square miles were nominally added to the settled area of the country. The next decade was marked by the civil war, and there was only

a small increase of the settled area. In the next decade the former ratio of grain was recovered.

On the supposition that in the year 1900 there will be a population of 100,000,000 in the United States and Territories, something like one-half of this increase may be expected in the area between the Missouri river and the Pacific Ocean. If population were to depend upon natural increase this gain could not be realized. But there are two kinds of immigra-
