The New Apportionment. THE number of Representatives in the next House has been fixed at three hundred and twenty-five. This was the highest number mentioned in the calculations of the Superintendent of the Census.

Gains—Arkansas, 1; California, 3; Georgia, 1; Illinois, 1; Iowa, 2; Kansas, 4; Kentucky, 1; Massachusetts, 1; Michigan, 2; Minnesota, 1; Mississippi, 1; Missouri, 1; Nebraska, 2; New York, 1; North Carolina, 1; Ohio, 1; Pennsylvania, 1; South Carolina, 2; Texas, 5; Virginia, 1; West Virginia, 1, and Wisconsin 1.

No other States are changed. It will be noticed that the loss falls on New England. This will give thirty-five new seats in the next House. Of these the South will get fifteen, the North twenty; and those last figures come pretty near showing how it will affect the next House politically.

THE Russians always do things on a large scale. In one of their custom houses there has been a steal amounting to forty-six million dollars. There are a good many people in the United States who have an idea that everything is honest in the civil service of other countries, because it is not often that there are public scandals. The occasional glimpses that are given justify the belief that there are a thousand times more corruption in Europe. It is to be borne in mind that the European press does not take upon itself the functions of an accuser or grand jury, and that when anything is said about rascality, it has already been proven by the representatives of the government who made the investigation.

THE noise about South American matters was evidently started for the purpose of injuring Blaine, and the first reports were well calculated to effect that object. Since he commenced to talk back, affairs present a very different appearance, and it now seems as if those who began the onslaught would have been better pleased had they kept silent. It is unfortunate that his opponents should attempt to raise a question of veracity between him and the President! It must result badly. It was long since predicted that Blaine might be abused into a nomination, and it begins to look that way. His enemies could not aid him more materially than by keeping him before the public by their constant onslaughts. It will naturally force him into the position of that great element of the Republican party who are opposed to any third term and the regency of the Conkling-Cameron-Logan triumvirate.

Gov. LEE, of Wyoming, reports that female suffrage in that territory had not broken up families, and on one occasion husband and wife—one a Democrat, the other a Republican—were candidates for the same office, without causing domestic trouble.

THE editor of the Standard argues that since his paper is Democratic it cannot favor monopolies. He says: "If the corporations which Mr. Villard represents shall attempt to control Oregon politics we shall certainly make it warm for him on that lay out, be it in the interest of one or the other party." This is fair warning to all the trembling cohorts that rank beneath the hostile banners.
