Cash Value of Missionaries.

THE popular estimate of foreign missions is that it costs a dollar to send twenty-five cents to foreign lands, and that the same zeal, labor and money expended upon pagans at home would yield much larger results.

Alter a trial of over sixty years the missionaries have something to say, and in a recently published treatise have gathered together testimony to the practical value and efficiency of their work.

To the question, "Do missions pay?" they say "yes." They have yielded large returns to the knowledge of mankind—its geography, geology, philosophy, history, general literature, medical science, music, commerce and the arts.

Noted travelers and scientists are cited in favor of their indebtedness to the researches and discoveries of missionaries. Carl Ritter, the famous geographer, says he could not have written his great work without the aid of the Missionary Herald, in which the reader must look to find the most valuable documents that have ever been sent over by any society.

Richard H. Dana, who recently died, the author of "Two Years Before the Mast," says of the Sandwich Island missions: "Every mission family was a source of civilizing influence; each mission house a dispensary, and each missionary a school-teacher. I have seen in their homes collections of animals, plants, shells and flowers, valuable to science, and they have often preserved the best, sometimes the only, records of volcanic eruptions, earthquakes and meteorological observations."

Many other missionaries have attained in heathen lands great reputation and usefulness as doctors, some of them by teaching modern medicine to the natives, others by substituting scientific medical treatment for the superstitious practices which constitute the healing art. They have established secular institutions of learning, like the college at Beirut and the Roberts College in Constantinople, and they challenge comparison with any other similar work for the same period of time in civilizing the people with whom they have come into contact.

"I HAVE been," writes the Bishop of Victoria (Hongkong), "again and again stopped while preaching, with the question, 'are you an Englishman?' Is not that the country that opium comes from? Go back and stop it, and then we will talk about Christianity."

THE Albany Argus thinks that if the Tammany organization in New York is dead it is a very lively corpse. In 1879 it elected a Republican Governor, in 1880 it defeated a Democratic candidate for President; in 1881 it beat the Democratic State ticket and in 1882 gave the Legislature to the Republicans, which is quite a series of exploits for a Democratic club to do.

Ordinance No. 449.

REGULATING THE POLICE FORCE OF THE City of Astoria. The City of Astoria does ordain as follows: Sec. 1. That no regular policeman of this city, while on duty, shall enter or remain in any saloon, house, room or building, whether, excepting oil business connected with his duties, as such policeman, for shall be while upon duty, drunk or partake of any spirituous, and l. times or other intoxicating liquor while on duty. Neither shall he be the owner of, or in any manner or interest either directly or indirectly, in any saloon, tavern, room, drinking shop, billiard room or hall of any kind.
