Geographical Christianity.

It will be remembered that between Methodists North, and Methodists South, an irreconcilable difficulty long existed; not on any particular matter of church discipline or creed, but on purely sectional issues, arising out of the war of secession. They are not quite ready yet to shake hands, but are not as those entirely without hope. A very plausible and practical plan of effecting the union of the great northern and southern divisions of the Methodist Episcopal Church has been published in a St. Louis paper of that denomination, which proposes to organize the three separate conferences—one by the Methodist Churches North, one by the Methodist Churches South, and one by all the churches west of the Mississippi river, with a superior general convention, having jurisdiction over the whole three to be composed of all the bishops. As the union of the northern and southern divisions of both the Presbyterian and Episcopal Churches was effected soon after the close of the civil war, the Methodists could not do better than follow so good an example.

Trading Jobs.

THERE would seem to be a good deal of "log-rolling" in the present Congress—trading off various jobs among the several supporters of the different schemes. The latest form of this species of jobbery is the proposition to raid the Treasury in behalf of public buildings to be erected in different parts of the country. There is real need of some of these edifices. But those which are actually required cannot be built unless money is granted at the same time for others that are not needed. Bills for appropriating money for the building of one hundred and thirty-two structures have already been introduced. The present Congress is likely to be an "extravagant" one, and the prevailing notion that the Treasury is overflowing has quickened into life many projects for the embellishment of towns and cities. And it will end in a revolt of the disgusted public, who will assuredly relegate to private life any member of Congress who makes a profligate record. Instead of promoting their popularity by wasting the public money, those M. C.'s will cut their own throats.

It is all right, of course, to give Grant ten thousand a year and put him on the retired list; to raise hundreds of thousands of dollars to give Mrs. Garfield; to give Mrs. Lincoln five thousand a year for life; etc., etc., but it does sound a little odd to hear that the two sisters of the gallant Lieut. Hayes, who lost his life and our Custer in '76, are in New York making underclothes for ten cents apiece, and in need of bread.

Ordinance No. 449.

REGULATING THE POLICE FORCE OF THE City of Astoria. Sec. 1. That no regular policeman of this city, while on duty, shall enter or remain in any saloon, house, room or building, whether, excepting on business connected with any duties as such policeman, nor shall he while upon duty, drink or partake of any alcoholic, malt, vinous or other intoxicating liquor, or any other beverage, or be in the possession of, or in any manner interested either directly or indirectly in any saloon, house, drinking shop, billiard room or hall, etc. Sec. 2. No police officer shall, while upon duty, be guilty of using any profane or abusive language to, or concerning any person or persons, or of exposing himself in a violent or disorderly manner. Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to report at least once in every month to the Board of Police Commissioners, a list of all policemen who are guilty of any of the offenses herein provided for, and if it shall appear on examination, that any such officer shall be guilty of any of the offenses herein provided for, or shall be found to be guilty of any of the offenses herein provided for, he shall be forthwith discharged from the Police Force.
