PROFOUND contempt for ignorance and stupidity has probably never been more delicately insinuated in polite language than upon the occasion of a recent acquittal by which a San Francisco jury let loose upon society a murderer whose criminality the evidence brought forward in the course of his trial had left no doubt upon the mind of the Judge. His honor, before dismissing the jurors from duties which, in his opinion, they had so ill-fulfilled, addressed them with ironical courtesy in the following terms: "Gentlemen of the jury—The intellectual process by the aid of which you have arrived at this remarkable verdict is one, if I may venture to say so, altogether beyond my powers of comprehension. But, gentlemen, I conceive it to be my duty upon so memorable an occasion as the present, to call your attention to the fact that the right to pardon criminals is reserved, by the law of this country, to the Governor of the State for the time being as one of the most precious privileges of his exalted office. This being so, you will excuse me, gentlemen, for expressing my humble opinion to the effect that it is scarcely altogether correct, or even decorous, in a common jury arbitrarily to arrogate this prerogative to itself. I speak, of course, under correction, and with all imaginable deference to your superior natural sagacity and legal knowledge. My appreciation of the nature and character of your functions, being that of a mere lawyer, is not likely to have much in common with your own. Such as it is, however, gentlemen, you are extremely welcome to it. I have the honor to wish you protracted exemption from the cares and responsibilities of the jury-box!"

THE Baltimore American comes near the truth when it says: Blaine has never been nominated for the presidency, but yet he has always led the victorious column. It is because he has been and is now the truest exponent of republican ideas, as they are held by the vast multitudes of American voters. He has that fine tact, that intuitive sense of what Americans feel and think, that make the true leader. He says at the right moment the thing 50,000,000 people are dumbly thinking, and says it in a way that goes to the heart like the proclamation of Napoleon on the eve of battle. Both he and Conkling are in retirement—one because of the national calamity of Garfield's assassination; the other because of his own stupendous folly as a leader, resigning for "a vindication." A WASHINGTON despatch says: Certain settlers at Juneau, Alaska, having made application to the secretary of the treasury for arms to protect themselves against natives, the request was referred to the secretary of war. It was found upon investigation, arms could only be supplied if it appeared that they were needed for protection of government property. The postoffice at Juneau constitutes the only government property at that place, and Acting Postmaster General Hutton, has accordingly made application for arms to be used in protection of the postoffice, so as to enable inhabitants of the town to defend themselves.
