Untenable Premises.

In an article by an eminent physician, in the New England Medical Journal for March we find these somewhat startling assertions: "Insane people, have no power to resist the strongest motive. No beings that ever lived possessed the power to do different from what they did."

There is a sophistry of reasoning calculated to mislead and beguile the mind. By it, wrong may be made to appear right, light darkness. Such we regard the reasoning that leads the mind to such conclusions as those given above. For instance, we are told by those who believe in this irresponsibility of action that no sane mind acts without motive—that motive is not subject to the will—that the mind must necessarily yield to the strongest motive,—and that therefore whatever a man does he is compelled to do.

This process of reasoning, if accepted, leaves the opponents of such conclusions without any ground to stand on. It takes away the last vestige of moral accountability, and makes him the veriest shuttlecock of irresistible fate.

If such were the prevailing belief of the world, man would soon settle back into the lower types from whence he sprung, and chaos would come again. But the reasoning, in our judgment, is fallacious, and the conclusions wrong.

It is no doubt true that man is very largely subject to conditions of birth, education and surroundings. We can readily see that he is a free moral agent only in a limited sense, if at all. If born in vice, and educated in crime, he will be very apt to be a criminal—although the rule is not absolutely invariable; and it is this variation of rule that lies at the basis of all evolution. Like a horse tethered to a stake, with a freedom to crop the herbage over a circumscribed area, so man, in a moral sense, is free to act within a certain length of rope. He knows the right from the wrong. He is capable of weighing and determining the motives that prompt him to do the one or avoid the other. If the wrong he does was the right thing for him to do,—the thing concerning which he had no volition and was compelled to do—why should he experience regret for wrong doing?

We say the reasoning which leads to such fatal conclusions as those quoted is erroneous. It makes man a mere machine, as helpless as the weather vane upon a church steeple, or the insensate clod that is swept along by the flood. The man who acts upon a criminal impulse or motive to steal, where detection and punishment are uncertain, restrains that impulse with the certainty of detection and punishment before him. Thus he is able to shape and control motive. And just here the weak point in the reasoning referred to is seen to be that it is based upon false premises. The strongest motive is not irresistible; or, if it is, then it is in some sense subject to the will. That is, one who wants a plausible excuse for doing wrong can readily shape the motive to afford him that excuse.

The human intellect is as many sided as the shape of the brain. In its operations we find that there is a mysterious something that seems to sit behind all the faculties, and that stimulates or curbs their actions—that encourages this and condemns that. This is the ego—the conscious ME—the autocrat of volition. Otherwise there could be no such thing as reason or judgment.

No man ever lived that did his best in all directions of his nature. If he reasoned himself into the conviction that he did, it was simply that he might find a pretext for

doing something that his inclinations invited, but which his judgment condemned.

Once grounded in this fatalism there would be nothing to stimulate man to effort. Why should he try, when trying costs self-denial and toil, and oftentimes sore hardship and privation? It would be far easier not to try. Why should he walk the thorny path of duty when the way of indolence was far more inviting? Besides, he would be entitled to no credit thereafter. If he went to the bad he couldn't help it, and if he did not it would be all the same!

It is well for the world that men take but little stock in such conclusions.

SENATOR JONES of Nevada struck the high tariff men a square blow when he remarked that their efforts were directed towards protecting the manufacturing capitalist and not the laborer against the European capitalist. The former sells in an American market in which foreigners cannot compete and he buys his labor in the open market in the world. The laborer buys in the protected market and sells, the only thing he has, his labor, in open market, meeting with competition of all kinds and nationalities. The Senator thought when laborers understood the question they would demand an open market in which to buy everything they needed. After a while the assertion that manufacturers are the only friends of the workingman, and only desire a tariff in order to maintain his wages, will cease to form one of the stock arguments for protection.

The surprising statement is made in the Oregon City enterprise that "the once fine bodies of timber along Puget sound and the Columbia river, are even now almost a thing of the past." We have ceased to expect accuracy from that paper, but still would like to see an effort to adhere to the truth.

THE editor of the Washington Independent takes considerable trouble to demonstrate the fact that he is a lunatic. There is something on the Oregon Statutes about such persons being allowed to run at large. We direct the attention of the Hillsboro authorities to this case.
