The French bark Henri Sampo, 520 tons, 107 days from Newcastle, arrived in last Sunday. The fine weather yesterday made every one feel as happy as a young goat on a stable roof.

The receipts of the Portland Ladies' Relief Society, for the year ending March 31st, were \$2,837. A. T. Bracke, S. L. Strange, and C. Timmins are the upper Astoria delegates in to-morrow's convention.

Capt. W. H. Troup, well known in this country as a machinist and engineer, died at Vancouver last Saturday. The State of California from San Francisco, arrived in at seven o'clock yesterday morning. She had the usual large number of passengers for this place.

Cedar timber of a fine quality exists in large quantities and easy of access near Neatucca bay, Tillamook county. The Garfield came in yesterday from San Francisco. She is loaded with cannery supplies and is discharging at Hume's dock.
