Canned Goods, "Iron Ware."

That their canned goods are iron ware, will be news to our cannery men here. In the city of Flensburg, Germany, an interpreter of the tariff has been found who has made the discovery. Canned goods pay, in Germany, a duty of 12 marks, (\$2.86) per 100 kilos, and iron ware, pays 24 marks, (\$5.72) per 100 kilos.

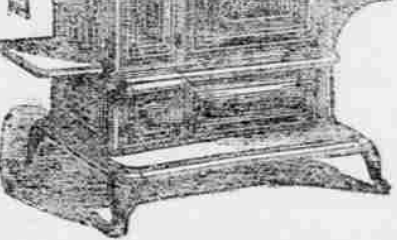
