Salmon Fishing.

Certain persons here, says the San Francisco Chronicle, claim to have caught salmon for canning purposes as far out as the Golden Gate, and that in the bay they are taken to some extent by the fishermen who supply the Sacramento river canneries.

In this connection, and by way of explanation, it may be well to state some of the habits of salmon. The general belief seems to be that when these fish attain the age of about one year they leave their fresh water haunts and go out to sea, returning in three or four years to the same place, or such as can get back to spawn.

Some of the fishermen hold to the belief that the salmon caught here in salt water come from the great rivers of the North instead of being propagated in the streams of this state.

The canneries are located at tide water, and none but the salt fish are preserved, schooners coming down to the fishing grounds to load from the boats of the fishermen.
