FISHERMEN'S MEETING.

Resolution and Declaration of Purposes.

The statement in yesterday morning's paper that the examination of Cyrus Crocker, mate of the ship Storm King, would take place in the U. S. Marshal's office at nine o'clock, brought a crowd of men very much interested in the matter to see what would be done.

Yesterday but little work was done by any of the fishermen or those connected with canneries work, and about noon a meeting was held at O'Brien's hotel, which, after informal proceedings, adjourned to meet in Liberty hall at half-past two.

Upon reassembling, the following was handed in for the consideration of the meeting: The name of this organization shall be THE PEOPLE'S PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION OF ASTORIA.

It is organized, 1st. For the purpose of protecting law abiding citizens and their property. 2nd. For the purpose of putting a stop to certain abuses practised in this city by men who are known as sailor runners.

Resolved, That this association appoint a committee of twenty-five to act for the association in warning and seeing that all parties who practice the above abuses be compelled to leave the city within a proper time, or at the discretion of the committee.

It was moved and seconded that the proceedings be published in THE ASTORIAN, and that a copy be sent to the city council; the meeting then adjourned till eight p. m.

The meeting reassembled at the last-named hour and J. C. Trullinger was appointed Treasurer; thus completing the organization.

A list was made up of certain parties whose presence is not desired in this community, and after further proceedings the meeting adjourned, having in a quiet and orderly manner done what they met to do.
