The War of 1886.

The military man of the Cincinnati Gazette publishes a brief imitation of the "Battle of Dorking" under the title "The War of 1886 - The Maritime Frontier - British Frigates Levy Contributions on Lake Cities." It begins thus: "At length the war came. Our brave men had blustered of war in Congress, on the stage and in the newspapers; the campaign for an aggressive foreign policy had defeated a jingo administration; we had wanted European powers off from our continent; had agitated for annexing the adjacent islands; had gotten the will of all other American states by our acts of superiority and protection; had threatened England for imprisoning the Fenian rebels; had winked at Fenian bandings to invade Canada; had, in short, provoked war, and made our nation a general nuisance; yet we had made almost no preparation. We could not make war at our leisure, and when it came upon us with the world and the blow together it took us by surprise." First came a commercial panic and a demand for the redemption of greenbacks and national bank notes in gold and silver. People supposed the coast cities would suffer chiefly from a war, but Great Britain having widened their Canadian canals, sent twenty armed frigates into Lake Ontario, and before the Welland canal, Canada had 50,000 militia armed and on the march. Buffalo demanded a contribution of \$1,000,000 in money, and all the coal required. The officer also burned down all railroad stations, and sent the Great Western at Jackson and Sherman at Atlanta. The frigate fired a few shells to hurry up the money when the citizens of Buffalo and made the rich men and banks hand it over. Toledo was assessed \$2,000,000, and the citizens of that city, in the officer quoted the annual reports of the Board of Trade and a "Detroit and Milwaukee were assessed \$3,000,000 each; Chicago \$4,000,000; and in spite of the protests of its citizens that their boats about their wealth was all wind, the officers took possession of the water works, and brought with a water famine. Sail vessels, steamers and tugs were all carried away for prize money to Canada ports. The war was thus brought home to the very heart of the country. These contributions were sent to the establishment of a despotism.
