Necessary Changes.

The following from the Portland Standard has some practical sense, but does not cover the entire ground:

The people, we believe, are to vote upon a very important constitutional amendment at this election. It is proposed to change the present limit of forty days to sixty, and in place of \$3 per day for the members to \$5. Under our present apportionment, this change would greatly increase the expenses of our legislature, and the people should consider it well before they create any additional burdens.

That the agitation of Irish affairs in Great Britain has been productive of some good, is very apparent from the effort of English Conservatives to get the advantage of Liberals in the matter of an Irish Land bill. The proposition of the former party to buy out all the landlords who are willing to sell their estates on the basis of twenty-one years of the rent, as judiciously fixed, has caused some uneasiness among the Liberal party, which fears that some political capital may be gained and lost thereby.
