

A Foul Murder.

LORD Frederick Cavendish, the new secretary of Ireland, and the under secretary Burke were brutally murdered in Phoenix Park, Dublin, last Saturday evening, being stabbed to death at the hands of parties unknown.

There seems to be something unfortunate about Ireland; just about the time that the patience which her people must cultivate by practice, for they are denied it by nature, results in a triumph, some idiot does something in a frenzy that sets every one's teeth on edge for another generation.

There's something appalling in the folly of the crime which was committed last night in Dublin, and by which bearers of the message of peace and good will were infamously done to death.

The effect which this act will have, and perhaps was meant to have, on the policy of conciliation will be incalculably harmful nor should we be surprised if it entailed the downfall of Gladstone's ministry in the very hour when it merited the highest esteem and confidence.

It is probable the crime was the work of miscreants who saw in Gladstone's conciliatory policy the ruin of their clandestine schemes, and who determined to paralyze it at the cost of a country the scoundrels pretended to serve, and by the butchery of the men who came on the blessed errand of delivery and pacification.

The Brooklyn Eagle says: Here we have another illustration of how swiftly fools may destroy what it has taken men ages of patient toil to build.

The New York Times: The assassination of the new chief secretary and permanent under-secretary of Ireland follows hard upon the announcement of the policy of bold conciliation by Gladstone's government.

It is in every light a terrible misfortune to the Irish people. If Ireland is to be put under military laws, it is safe to say Gladstone would neither assume nor be entrusted with the task.

There is in this horrible event one suggestion which Americans cannot regard without shame. It is that brutal assassination, which disgraces Ireland and endangers the best interests of the Irish, is in harmony with the teachings of certain residents of this country, who have steadily advocated it in order to fill their own pockets.

The thing seems so preposterously foolish that we must naturally think it was an enemy instead of a supposed friend of the Irish people that perpetrated the cruel deed.
