Canadian Independence.

At a recent annual dinner of the "Club Nationale," composed of young French Canadians in Montreal, President Cannon, in proposing the toast, "Canada: Our Country," dwelt upon the subject of Canadian independence.

The toast was responded to by Hon. Mr. Mercer, member of the Provincial legislature. In the course of his speech he said he had come to the conclusion that it was his duty to go even as far as independence.

On the 4th inst., Senator Grover introduced a bill to pay all persons who rendered service or furnished supplies in Oregon and Washington territory during the late Nez Percés Indian war and pensions to those injured in service or the widows and children of those killed therein.
