Two barges Columbia and Columbia Chief are loading with railroad iron at Flavel's dock.

Guitaun's latest effort to obtain a stay of proceedings has failed. He will be hanged on the 20th of June.

The Mount Washington and Philip Fitzpatrick cleared for sea yesterday. Their cargoes aggregated a total value of \$98,339.

The old public school property was sold at public auction E. C. Holden. It was bought by W. W. Parker for \$1,900.

Attention is directed to the announcement of F. D. Winton as an independent candidate for the office of County Judge.

The State of California arrived in at 5:10 yesterday morning. Captain Delaney makes fast time, and always lands the Astoria freight and mail.

The Texas Siftings says a pine tree that was cut down in Oregon, not long since, reminds one of Washington City. It has more than a thousand rings.

Charles A. Morden, formerly half-owner of the Eureka (Nev.) leader, but more recently of Portland, is sojourning for a brief season in Astoria.

The U. S. District Court in Portland has decided that the cutting of timber on unurveyed government land is a trespass, and that parties so trespassing are liable in the amount of the value of the timber cut.

The Jacksonville Times says "Mrs. Taylor (nee Mrs. Dr. Greenman) died at the family residence at Phoenix this week." This is the first instance on record of a lady being married before she was born.

Umatilla Indians catch 500-pound sturgeons in the Columbia by setting a line with a large hook attached, baited with beef. The line is several hundred feet long and the huge fish makes a mighty splashing before it is landed.

When Mrs. C. A. Ball, who has been visiting A. F. Johns' family at this place, received a dispatch last evening that her husband was dead, it was a terrible blow to the grief-stricken lady. The evening before, she received a dispatch from him, at which time he was in perfect health.

The Welcome comes back at the Standard, which has justly made a fuss about candidates for popular favor belonging to certain societies that ostracize a man on account of his religious belief. It says by implication that the chairman of the State Democratic Committee "is one of them fellows." Explanations and denials will soon be in order.

In Captain Flavel's office is a picture, just purchased Portland for \$200, painted by Cleveland Rockwell, entitled "A Smoky Sunrise in the Harbor of Astoria." The scene is at ebb tide; the harbor displays a profusion of sailing craft, and over Tongue Point a smoky sun casts a dusky glimmer of streaked light over the surface of the bay, while to the north the gray of early morning is warning into a purple tint that fills the circumambient air.

Mr. Fenton's Speech.
 Liberty hall was lit up last Monday night, the occasion being a speech as per announcement by W. D. Fenton, the Democratic nominee for Congress of the United States from the commonwealth of Oregon. At eight o'clock Mr. Fenton was introduced by S. D. Adair, chairman of the evening, and immediately began to speak on the current issues of the day.

He prefaced his remarks by the statement that he would say nothing personal or discourteous, and that more especially against his political antagonist, Hon. M. C. George, nothing should be said by him that could be construed as being either personal or vindictive.

He believed that the time had about gone by when such cheap efforts as belittling one's opponents would be effective, that the newspapers, free schools and other educational influences had so raised the standard of popular knowledge that a few clear tangible facts were more demanded than volumes of irresponsible and untrustworthy statements.

The speaker then enlarged upon the history of Democracy and the early days of the Republic; made eulogistic allusion to Thos. Jefferson and the prestige of American arts and arms under the rule of that statesman, and hoped the time would never come when the principles that actuated the bosom of that patriot would cease to find an affirmative echo in the hearts of us who dwell in troublesome times of tariffs and Chinese immigration. From 1789 to a discussion of the tariff was a natural transition and the defects of our present tariff and the beneficial results accruing from unlimited free trade as viewed from a Democratic standpoint, were warmly placed before the audience. Certain allegations were made concerning the onerous system of taxation and deductions made therefrom, that were of practical concern to all present. This part of his speech was in direct confirmation and was partly a repetition of what the Oregonian and THE ASTORIAN have said on that most important subject. His assumption, however, that the Republican party was responsible for the system that threw best under what he styled "fifty years of Democratic rule" had the charm of novelty in a greater degree than it possessed the merit of consistency. His statements in relation to American commerce were erroneous, and that in particular wherein he said that with the exception of one or two iron steamers plying from San Francisco there were none carrying the American flag, was in direct opposition to the facts. For the last eight years an American line has been plying between Philadelphia and Liverpool flying the American flag and owned by the Pennsylvania Railroad company. It was on one of these steamers that Grant went to Europe in 1877. We are confident, however, from Mr. Fenton's manner of delivery that his mistakes were unintentional.

From a discussion of the tariff question in which his views must in general meet the approbation of a good many Republicans and Democrats, he passed to a consideration of the Chinese question in which it is likewise a hard matter to get up a party discussion. He quoted strong Republican authority both ways and made fair capital out of the fact that it is the Democrats in Congress that are to be thanked for the present anti-Chinese bill prohibiting immigration for even ten years, and that it is our Republican President Arthur who is to blame for insulating the demands of American labor by vetoing the measure so strongly and unanimously urged by the people of this coast. He omitted however to make any reference to the recent national legislation on the matter of polygamy, and the zeal displayed in announcing the vote in Congress on the Chinese question did not continue long enough to furnish any statistics in reference to the equally one sided vote on the question of excluding Mormons from holding office.

We were very desirous of hearing Mr. Fenton's views on the matter of the Astoria land grant. We would have been glad to give his remarks in extenso had he seen fit to put himself on record. It would have been a good hit, politically, for him to have done so, for our present Congressman, Mr. George, has not displayed the spirit that we expected in dallying with this great bar to the progress of our country and city. It is not of transcendent importance which side of the political camp help would come from. We would just as soon have Republican help as Democratic aid, but Mr. Fenton was silent, and beyond the general declaration that he "had no pledges to make," and would take due

care to uphold "the rights of the people," we heard no words of promise concerning the topic most important to Clatsop county.

Mr. Fenton is a young man that makes a fine appearance on the platform; has a good presence, a pleasant voice, and a convincing manner, and held the attention of his audience for two hours. He impressed us as a man who wants to do right and is sincere in his beliefs, and should he see fit to favor us with a positive expression of his views on the matter of making railroad corporations forfeit unearned land grants we will gladly give them the publicity that our columns afford.

Sudden Death.
 PORTLAND, May 16.
 EDITOR ASTORIAN: Charles A. Ball, a well-known lawyer, was found dead at noon to-day in a Chinese opium house on the corner of 2d and Stark streets. He was considerably under the influence of liquor last night and about 11 o'clock went to the house, whose proprietor was one of his clients, and fell over on the bed in a stupor. He lay on his face and evidently died of strangulation. He leaves a wife and one child, a daughter of 14. The Circuit Court adjourned on account of his death till next Monday. Ball was one of the counsel to defend Bradley, whose case was set for to-morrow.
