Columbia River Scenery.

A WRITER in the current number of the Pacific Christian Advocate, speaking of the scenery of the Columbia river, says: When in 1792 the bark Columbia cut its perilous way across the bar and opened to the astonished eye of civilization the broad vista of river and bay and island that swept into the deep embrace of the distant mountains, there was unlocked to future enterprise one of its grandest theatres of toils and triumphs.

Entering the river and sailing eastward, both the northward and the southern view are bounded by distant parallel ranges of mountains, presenting every variety of outline. Now they are bold, craggy and precipitous, or again they roll with a gentle easy swell into green and golden summits, among which the valleys of the mountain streamlets gracefully meander toward the river or the sea.

Thirty years ago Theodore Parker, King, Holmes and Emerson were glad to lecture anywhere for \$50 a night. Parker at that time originated a celebrated saying concerning fame: "What do you get for such service?" asked a Boston friend. "Fame," was the reply. "And is that all?" exclaimed the orator, in his consequential manner, "means \$50 and my expenses." 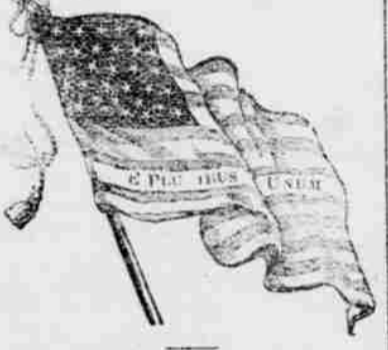
