Sounding on the Bar.
 A PARTY consisting of Captain F. C. Powell, Lieutenant Buchanan, Frank Moores, Pilot Bohaug, A. B. Slauson, of the Oregonian, and others went on the Brenham yesterday to see the progress made in scraping on the middle sands, and note the working of the new scraper which the Escort No. 2 had in charge, and which will work in conjunction with the Brenham. The trial of the work was in every way satisfactory, and though nothing definite relative to the workings of the new machinery could be definitely ascertained, sufficient is known to warrant Capt. Powell in the opinion that it will prove a valuable adjunct to the scraper now worked by the Brenham. There is now a depth of eighteen feet in the channel through the middle sands. Capt. Powell is of the opinion that with comparatively little attendant effort a channel can be made with a depth of twenty-four feet at low water. "This a consummation devoutly to be wished," with such a depth of water assured, the ships of twenty-two feet draught that are now ordered to San Francisco and the Sound can safely enter and load.

MANY old or rare medals and stamps have been recently sold at what seemed marvellous prices. The sales at least show that the owner did a very prudent thing in making the collection thus dispersed. Some of them were enhanced in value by their relation to historical incidents. A collection of revenue stamps made now, will undoubtedly prove a good investment. The time must come very soon when these will be handled with scrupulous care, increased by the assurance that, more than fifteen years after the end of the war, out of the necessities of which the use of these stamps grew, the government persisted in enforcing their use, and that a patient people submitted to the extortion until the surplus of revenue increased to such an enormous amount that it became a fund over which congressmen and congressional lobbyists quarrelled for plunder under forms of legislative measures that took this surplus by dips of ten, twenty, fifty and even an hundred million of dollars at a time. Illuminated by such historical narratives, a collection of such revenue stamps that went upon matches with which the poor lighted fires, upon the medicines which cured the sick, upon the check that paid a subscription to a charity, and upon a dozen other articles of family use, will become not only an interesting but peculiarly a valuable possession.

KING KALAKAUA is to have two thrones with all the modern appliances, made for him at Boston. All of the Yankee improvements will be added and he will be the only monarch in the world who is the owner of two places where the royal personage can repose in state. It is surmised that one of them is intended for his feet. The dusky monarch would appear more graceful standing beside a barber's chair. The bills for all of this nonsense are, for the most part, paid by a few score of American citizens who own plantations and have control of the business of the Sandwich Islands.

The recent collection of assessments from federal officeholders is to be the subject of judicial investigation. A more flagrant disregard of the proprieties and of public sentiment, has seldom been shown by a political committee, but it will be hard to prove that anybody is guilty of crime. The members of the congressional committee are not ordinarily considered public officers, they will probably escape the meshes of the law.

Unless they are purposely inviting defeat, it is hard to see why they should have been so defiant of the best sentiment of the party.

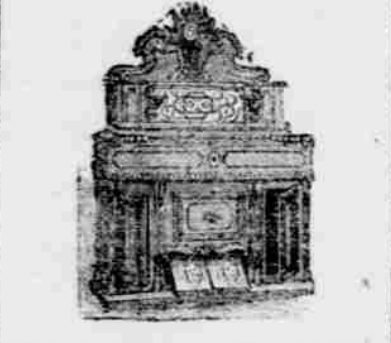

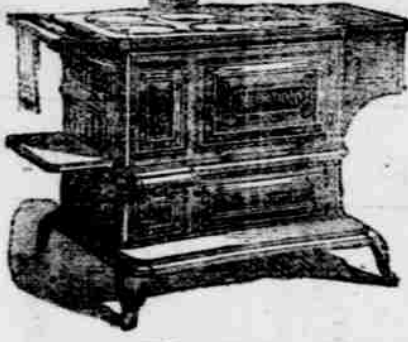

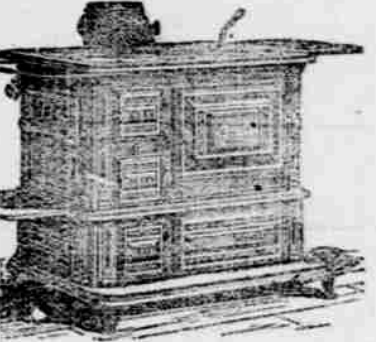
