The acts of incendiarism and murderous massacres committed by his army are attributed to his silent consent, if not his authorization, and this fact has tarnished whatever good reputation he enjoyed by those who regarded him as a patriot, anxious for a constitutional Egyptian autonomy. Whatever his aims may be, they are not generally understood, while his methods meet with almost universal reprobation. He finds an able defender in Geo. S. Batcheller, one of the international tribunal, in Egypt, who resided in Cairo seven years, and is thoroughly conversant with Egyptian affairs. This gentleman says of him: One thing is certain, that the original movement of Arabi Pasha was that of a patriot seeking to relieve his countrymen of foreign oppression, and to establish what is popularly known as home rule.




