A Consistent Rebel. The latest from Arabi Pasha, who at present monopolizes the attention of civilization, is that he is at the head of 160,000 men; is preparing to attack Cairo; has 200 guns planted for the attack; is in correspondence and negotiation with native chiefs and other disaffected persons.

The world has formed a harsh judgment of this man, founded more upon recent events transpiring at Alexandria than from any well-ascertained knowledge of his true character. The acts of incendiarism and murderous massacres committed by his army are attributed to his silent consent, if not his authorization, and this fact has tarnished whatever good reputation he enjoyed by those who regarded him as a patriot, anxious for a constitutional Egyptian autonomy. Whatever his aims may be, they are not generally understood, while his methods meet with almost universal reprobation. He finds an able defender in Geo. S. Batcheller, one of the international tribunals, in Egypt, who resided in Cairo seven years, and is thoroughly conversant with Egyptian affairs. This gentleman says of him: 'One thing is certain, that the original movement of Arabi Pasha was that of a patriot seeking to relieve his countrymen of foreign oppression, and to establish what is popularly known as home rule.' In a two-column-and-a-half article of the New York Tribune, Mr. Batcheller vindicates Arabi from much of the censure cast upon him, and explains many of his movements, which to one unacquainted with the man, he thinks are at this time inexplicable. He gave credit to Arabi for his accomplishments as a scholar, and abilities as a military hero. Praise of a kindred nature is bestowed upon Arabi by Mr. Wolf, who was our consul general in Egypt. He tells us of Arabi:

He knows all about the United States, its history and struggles, and told me repeatedly that his desire was to have a constitutional form of government. When I presented him with a copy of the biography of Garfield in French, he at once said he would have it translated into Arabic, so that the youth of Egypt could profit by it. At my suggestion he ordered the translation of the constitution of the United States into Arabic. He is not fanatic, but is a patriot, and therefore resorts to many expedients and devices not exactly in consonance with the views of foreigners, who have neither love nor sympathy with him or his country. Evidently it will take time to enable us to read this man's character in its historical light. Americans can await developments, as they have no inducement to form an erroneous estimate of Arabi. If he can acquit himself of complicity in the Alexandrian outrages, they will be prepared to judge him by a higher standard than that of being a mere outlaw and desperado.
