Council Proceedings.

On the 23d inst. the city council met in regular session. A proposition from D. P. Thompson in regard to putting up waterworks in this city, was read, and referred to the committee on public property. The resignation of Ang. Miller as city sexton and lamplighter, to take effect September 1st, was read and accepted. A petition from property owners asking council to have the grades of the crossings of Arch and West-7th streets raised six feet, together with the report of the committee on streets, was read, and report adopted. The report of the street committee on the resolution instructing the committee to communicate with G. W. Hume, in reference to Cushing court, was read, and on recommendation, adopted. The same course was pursued in reference to the report of the wharf committee regarding the petition of N. W. Tallant. The police judge's report for July was referred to the health committee. An ordinance was passed amending an ordinance prescribing the manner and extent of building a wharf by N. W. Tallant. The following claims were allowed: Chas. Heilborn, \$7.50; D. C. Hamey, \$1.70; J. J. Riley, \$1.70; J. C. Trullinger, \$9.00; Homer Gibson, \$3.50; Martin Dillon, \$17.25; D. Whipple, \$24; I. W. Case, \$74.15; THE ASTORIAN, \$4.75; J. W. Gearhart, \$21.70; Jewett & Kimball, \$4.00; R. Carruthers, \$13.90; D. Whipple, \$56; B. F. Stevens & Co., \$3.50. The remaining claims were referred. The ordinance referring to the extension of Concomly street was referred to the committee on streets. The council then adjourned till 12 m., yesterday, when that ordinance was read and the committee's report was accepted. After the passage of resolutions instructing the auditor and clerk to give notice concerning the improvement of Court and Wall streets, the council adjourned to meet next Saturday evening.

Politics in California.

Under date of the 22d the New York Tribune publishes an interview with Senator Miller, who said of Republican prospects in California: "There will be a very close contest, but I think we can carry it if we nominate a good ticket. Stoneman, the Democratic candidate for governor, is a good man and a strong candidate. He is a popular man and an old soldier. I have repeatedly written home that we must nominate the best man. We are not in position on the Chinese question, but we are better off on that than the Democrats are. We are in position to say that we made an effort to exclude Chinese and succeeded partly in spite of the strong opposition of our own party in the east, while the Democrats, as we can point out, made no effort of any sort when they were in power. Farley, the last Democratic senator from our state, made no move at all. He probably could not have succeeded, but he didn't even try. All that has been accomplished, though it was not all that the people demanded, has been done by Republicans."

"I suppose the Chinese problem is a great question in your state canvass," said the reporter. "Oh, an all-important one in this issue, as it was in 1880." "Did the Morey letter forgery greatly affect the vote in 1880?" "Fully 6,000 or 7,000 votes. The denial of its genuineness was not received in time. It was received, but nobody would believe that so bold a forgery could be committed. That was the trouble."

The French journals are unanimous in their denunciation of England's action in occupying the Suez canal.

Treasury Receipts.

A WASHINGTON despatch of the 22nd, says: Receipts of the treasury daily are more than ever known before within the memory of the department, the amount averaging \$1,500,000 a day, and were it not that special appropriations made by congress for private claims, deficiencies, etc., are pouring in, the debt reduction for the month would be perhaps the largest in the history of the past 20 years. Receipts for the month will amount to nearly \$50,000,000.

Beyond doubt from this there is to be taken as one item \$9,500,000 for pensions alone, besides current expenses and the special warrants above mentioned.

Since congress adjourned on the 8th of the month there have been 240 to 300 of these claims under deficiency bills and private acts put through each day. From this source the estimate of the disbursements will not fall much short of a million a day. This class of drafts on the treasury will fall off soon however, always running along for about a month after congress adjourns, by which time almost every claim provided for in appropriation bills is presented. While the debt reduction may not be so great this month as would naturally be expected from the extraordinary receipts, it is not unlikely next month's surplus will require another call for 3 1/2 per cents, to dispose of it.

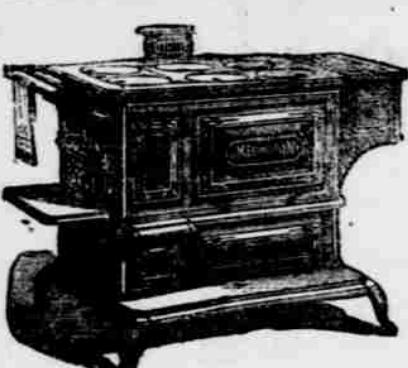
Equalization of Assessments.
