SPEAKING OF Arizona routes, General Sherman said in that territory there are 4,500 Apache Indians of peculiar character. They entertain everlasting hatred toward the Spanish race, and were kept corralled by the military to prevent them making depredations upon the settlers of that country, and sometimes they broke away from the corral, after the fashion of animals. In a recent case one hundred and ninety Apaches had broken out, killed forty settlers and escaped into Old Mexico, where they had been wiped out by Mexican troops. Frequent mails gave warning of such outbreaks, and gave settlers an opportunity to make defenses.

The people delegate their power to their representatives in the national and state legislatures with the idea that statutes in their interest may be enacted, but the authority too often assumed by these representatives in re-delegating this power to a corporate organization not at all responsible to the people, is one of the growing and dangerous evils of the day.

A Paris milliner has contracted for the skins of 30,000 pigeons for the adornment of hats and bonnets this fall. The birds are to be caught in all parts of Germany, and dealers in Berlin are filling the order. What a slaughter of the innocents.

In theory, congress is the representative of the people and voices the will of the nation, and if it does not do so practically, the fault lies with the producers and creators of wealth, in voting for those who misrepresent them.
