Injustice.

The panic which seems to have seized upon the English bench in consequence of the Irish excitement, is far from creditable to the magistracy of Great Britain. In its way it matches the parliamentary scare over the channel tunnel. In the London central criminal court, three weeks ago, and before so conscientious a judge as Sir James Fitzjames Stephen, the police brought up a compositor in the printing office of the Freiheit. He had been convicted of having "published a scandalous, wicked and immoral libel concerning the murder of Lord Frederick Cavendish and Mr. Thomas H. Burke." His counsel addressed the court in mitigation of punishment, alleging that when his client entered the office of the Freiheit as a compositor he did so, as anyone else might do, to look for work, and that as to the number of the paper containing the article he only composed and set up a very little portion of it on the second page. The article which appeared on the first page he only saw after it had been printed, and even had it been contrary to his own feelings and wishes he could not have helped the matter, and he would not have written such an article himself. Counsel also called to witnesses to speak to the prisoner's good character, who stated that the poor fellow was not a man of any pronounced political views whatsoever. Nevertheless, in a spirit which savors stronger of the days of Charles II. and of the Popish plot, than of the reign of Victoria, Justice Stephen not only sentenced the poor printer to imprisonment, but in pronouncing sentence actually said: "Although you have been connected with the paper in a subordinate capacity you have taken an active part in publishing it to the world at large. It must be clearly understood that sentiments of that kind cannot in England, and indeed in any other decently-governed country, be advocated with impunity. I shall pass a lenient sentence, but it must not be at all understood as indicating any want of detestation on the part of the abominable crime committed by those who took part in the writing of the article." It has been for at least a century a part of British crown law that evil must concur with evil act to make a man guilty of an offense punishable with degrading imprisonment. Yet here was an absolutely innocent agent condemned apparently in order to afford a passionate and terrified jury and an excited judge an opportunity to manifest their "detestation of the abominable crime" committed by a printer in setting up "a part" of a libel which he declared that he would on no account have written!

Advices from Yokohama, under date of the 11th inst., say that ill feeling among American residents of Japan is excited by the repeated and apparently studied discourtesies to the United States flag on the part of British naval officers. The American ship Swatara left Yokohama homeward bound, July 27th, and was saluted according to custom by the war ships of every nationality except the English. The British fleet at Yokohama was sent away on the 2d of July last and remained at sea over the Fourth, avoiding the necessity for a salute. Similar incidents were of constant occurrence during Gen. Grant's visit, and the determination of British army officers at Hongkong to withhold salutes on Washington's birthday has been a cause of difference between those officers and the governor, Sir John Hennessy, who shows the sense of the proprieties on such occasions. It is claimed on behalf of British agents that their conduct is regulated by orders from London.
