The Wheat Harvest.

From various portions of Oregon and Washington come flattering reports of the wheat harvest, although it is two weeks early in making a proper estimate. In but a few unimportant localities has the yield been small, while in principal districts, especially of the Willamette valley, it has been enormous—the heaviest ever gathered. In Washington county many fields average 60 bushels to the acre, while the lowest reported is 27 1/2, and so clean as not to require being put through a cleaner before shipment. As near as can be estimated at the present time we will have for shipment, foreign, at least 230,000 tons; and if we are not far astray, those figures will be largely increased, as Linn county alone has a harvest of 60,000 tons. During the past week the rates were still, as purchases were necessary for cargo to avoid demurrage. In the absence of transactions, nominal quotations only can be given. Walla Walla, f. o. b., 1.57 1/2; Valley, f. o. b., \$1.60 per cental. Five cents per cental must be deducted from above rates if only delivered alongside.—Portland Journal of Commerce.

Aristocratic Lobbying.

MUCH has been said about Conkling's honesty and his contempt of many of the practices which are occasionally indulged in by public men. It is now proving to be a fiction; Conkling does not lobby around the corners of legislative halls, but conducts his business in an aristocratic sort of way, and practices his art upon the governor of a state, or the President of the United States. For a fifteen thousand dollar fee he secured a Presidential veto from Arthur, congress having passed a bill which the foreign steamship companies did not like. He had less success as a practitioner before Governor Cornell, having been unable to consummate a hundred thousand dollar swindle for Jay Gould, for which he had received a fee as an attorney. That is the cause of the present hostility of some of the stalwarts, to one of the most distinguished men that ever represented the state of New York. The same sort of hostility who do not decide cases in a way to suit the distinguished advocate who can get princely fees for mediocre speeches. In all of this there is not a thing which any court would decide to be illegal or criminal, yet one would be peculiarly blunt in his moral perceptions, who would not regard it as bordering on the infamous. A political boss who is strong enough to place a judge upon the bench, will naturally be very apt to win his big cases; when a big fee is given to the boss, it is not for his ordinary services as an attorney, but his influence as a political manager. There are thousands of men, who could make before President Arthur or Governor Cornell, just as good an argument as Conkling, and who would be regarded as being well paid if they received a fee of five hundred dollars. Conkling is only one of a multitude of lawyer-politicians who secure ridiculously large fees for an apparently simple service. It is an aristocratic species of lobbying which may contain the very worst species of corruption, and which cannot be broken up until the whole system of machine politics has been destroyed. The people of many of the states are now engaged in that laudable undertaking.
