Hop Culture.

NEARLY all our Washington territory exchanges contain articles relative to the present impetus WEDNESDAY, SEPT. 27. '82. given to hop raising and the extra ordinary opportunity it affords any one with a little land and a fair stock of patience to make money in the culture of that vegetable. In an article on the subject, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer

Hops are now selling here at about 45 cents a pound, but they cannot long remain at that if the price in England is to be \$1 and upwards.

is about 8 cents a pound. Taking Mr. (he Burress and Mr. Joe Allen. the higher production, for a convenience, we find \$160 to be the cost of 2,000 pounds of hops. Sold at 45 cents a pound \$900 are obtained; the actual profit being \$740 for the season's work. At \$1 a pound the product will realize the grower \$1,880 over all expenses, while at \$2.50 he will haul in the very comfortable sum of \$5,000. At such rates the growers hereabout, who have thirty or forty acres each-and one has over ninety-become veritable princes as far as income is concerned.
