The Senatorship.

(SPECIAL TO THE ASTORIAN.) SALEM, Sept. 18th—6:30 P. M. The situation remains unchanged. There will be a Republican caucus to-night, in which it is probable that thirty-eight, and certain that thirty-six will participate. This caucus will undoubtedly nominate Mitchell. It is pretty generally settled now that the Democrats have given up any intention of holding a caucus. Several of them state publicly their intention to vote for Mitchell. It is said that there are sixteen Republicans who are equally free in expressing their intention to vote against Mitchell. The general belief around the capitol is that Mitchell will be elected, but not until after a protracted fight.

The twenty-second annual exhibition of the Oregon state fair association began to-day; weather and prospects very good.

The people of Salem want a railroad to Astoria. If Salem will help us to get the unearned railroad grant declared forfeited, there will be some chance. The railroad will be begun within three months after that grant is out of the way. The Astoria railroad grant is now used to prevent any one from building to Astoria by those whose interests are to have no road here. We wish all the Willamette valley people who wish a railroad to Astoria to sign a petition to have the land grant forfeited. In those degenerate days of free passes we may not succeed, but we will make the effort if our Willamette valley friends will join us.

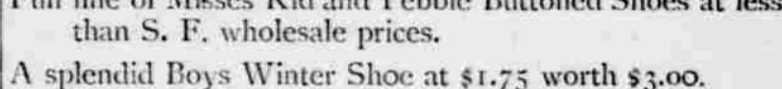
