Still Balloting.

Two ballots were taken to-day, thus relieving the monotony attendant on a single ballot; both gave the same result—Mitchell, 36; Prim, 33; Failing, 17; Thayer, 3; George, 1. The substitution of Failing and Thayer for Williams and Boise, is an indication of the fluctuations in the minds of those who are opposed to the decisions of the caucus. It is generally believed that balloting will continue for several days, if the anti-Mitchell men continue changing, but if they try any attempt to concentrate on Williams or Dolph, the Democrats will rally to the Mitchell standard. They say that if they must have a Republican they prefer Mitchell. Men who claim to see as far into a grindstone as anybody, say that some Democratic votes will be cast for Mitchell to-morrow. If so, he will be elected.
