A VERY serious question has arisen throughout the United States in regard to the jury system. Is trial by jury played out? way. Is it possible to secure a jury which will honestly try and determine a case on the evidence presented in court, without fear, favor or affection? The fact that all these questions are being put in all states of the Union is prima facie evidence that the jury system is corrupt, and that a condition of things exists in connection with the courts which threatens the foundation of social order. If the administration of justice be corrupt at the fountain head-in the San Francisco National Brewery jury box-what hope is there for the conservation of personal and At Alex, Gilbert's, corner Beaton and Conpopular rights? Trial by jury has ever been regarded, in Anglo Saxon communities, as the best possible guarantee of the rights of individuals against the rich and powerful. The jury, in times past, stood between the people and arbitrary government; and if it had been corrupt, in not a few instances in the history of constitutional FRESH CANDIES AND NUTS.

liberty and religious toleration. In this country the foundations of civil liberty are laid deep and broad in the constitution, and there is nothing to dread from arbitrary government; but there is much to Bell Tower. dread from social and moral dryrot, which naturally manifests itself, first of all, in the corruption of justice by the perversion of the jury system. The danger to the social fabric from this cause is not less fatal than it would be were the republic menaced by imperialthe republic menaced by imperialism. In the latter case, the manhood of the nation would rise in its might and brush aside at once and forever the instruments of autocracy; but, in the former, the danger lies in the body of the people themselves; is selfereated, cated by a thorough awakening of John P. Classon and of refinership heretofore existing between the public conscience, and the infliction of stern justice in the case of all who may be proved to have been guilty of corruptly inflaence ing juries, or of having been so in fluenced while acting in the capacity of a juror. That this evil has become a great and overshadowing one is well known to bench and bar. It is, perhaps, within the power of the courts, sustained by a patriotic and pureminded bar, to destroy it root and branch; but when we consider the influence by which the judiciary is elected all over the Union, and the relations of lawyers to their cli ents, we are not hopeful of any effective action in this quarter. A judiciary that is dependent on popular suffrage for its position is not going to make war against a system which might be used, with crushing effect, to destroy all future hope of a preferment. If the reform comes at at all, it must COUNTRY PRODUCE. come from the people. The moral sense of American citizens must be aroused to the necessity for removing the foul blot of bribery and corruption from their judicial system. If the respectable and conservative element of society takes this matter in hand, those actively engaged in the administration of justice would willingly co-operate; but while the best ciass of citizens remain supine the evil will grow and intensify.

THE Chicago Tribune thinks if the men in the civil service of the United States may be justly taxed to the extent of \$400,000 or \$500. 000 a year for party purposes, then it is evident these men are paid that much in excess of a just and fair compensation for their services; and that under the pretext of appropriating money for the public service, the money is voted from the treasury for party purposes.

THE Egyptian authorities conider the country is generally so rapidly returning to its normal condition, that a further display of force in the provinces is unnecessary. The Times says it has been decided to retain for the present 12,000 men in Egypt to carry on and consolidate the work for which the suppression of Arabi Pasha does little more than clear the FRUITS. 
