The Bar Improvement.

On the Queen of the Pacific went out yesterday morning the visiting board of engineers, which have been viewing the bar and discussing plans for its improvement since their arrival three weeks ago.

The men who constitute the commission, after visiting the various sections tributary to the Columbia river exports, cannot fail to be favorably impressed with the requirements of the Northwest. The magnitude of our exports will be known to them through personal observation, and the amount required for this commercial improvement, which is by no means simply for the wants of Oregon, but also for eastern Washington and northern Idaho, an extent of territory greater and capable of producing more grain than any western state in the Union.

Those Pilot Bills. YESTERDAY'S Oregonian, commenting upon the pilot bill introduced by Senator Reed, and which was published in full in THE ASTORIAN, says that it is a "deceitful measure," and declares that it should not pass the legislature, at the same time it commends the one passed by the Portland board of trade which is also defective.

We agree with the Oregonian where it says: "This measure should be in no sense a subject of contention as between Portland and Astoria; nor is it. There is no rivalry be-

tween them in a matter that relates to the good of both and to the general welfare of the country.

But it is unfair to urge the passage of such a bill as Judge Deady prepared as it would be to champion Reed's to the detriment of the first one. That is a good feature of Deady's bill that leaves the appointment or selection of the commissioners to the Portland board of trade, the Astoria chamber of commerce and the governor of the state, but how manifestly unjust it is to compel the pilots to pay the expenses of the commission and to allow river pilotage to be optional.

A Population of 50,155, 783.

The census bureau has issued a bulletin classifying the population in 1880 by nativity. The native-born were: Whites, 36,843,291; colored, 6,632,549; foreign-born, 6,679,943; total population, 50,155,783. Of the foreign-born 2,772,169 were natives of Great Britain and Ireland, 1,906,742 of the German empire, 717,084 of British America, 194,337 of Norway, 181,729 of Sweden, 106,971 of France, 101,541 of China, and the remainder represent all the countries of the earth. In 1880 the total population of Virginia was 1,512,665; the total number of persons in the United States who were born in Virginia was 2,118,460. Tennessee, population, 1,542,339; Tennesseeans in the country, 1,787,594; Ohio, population, 3,198,062; Ohioans in the country, 3,302,656; North Carolina, population, 1,339,750; total North Carolinians, 1,638,058; Kentucky, population, 1,648,690; total Kentuckians, 1,856,310; Georgia population, 1,542,180; Georgians in the country, 1,719,068; Alabama, population, 1,262,505; Alabamians in the country, 1,319,189; South Carolina, population, 995,577; South Carolinians in the country, 1,153,311; Vermont, population, 332,286; Vermonters in the country, 430,041; Maryland, population, 94,943; Marylanders in the country, 953,141; Maine population, 638,946; natives of Maine in the country, 745,272; Delaware, population 146,608; Delawareans in the country, 155,517. In all the other states and territories the population is greater than the total number of natives of the respective states in the whole country.
