At the last meeting of the Portland Board of Trade there was submitted for the consideration of that body a proposition to improve the Columbia bar, by a New York engineer—H. F. Knapp—who modestly states: "I can fully assure your people that your bar and river will never be and never can be improved by any other plan. By my plan it will be permanently improved without any future work, such as dredging, etc., to keep it open, and all I want is a fair hearing to convince you all. I am thoroughly opposed to any plan that starts out with any contraction of the channel and mouth by jetties of any sort, as the little increased depth got by such means only lasts as long as the work and expenditure is kept up, and when that stops the channel and bar becomes shallower and worse than ever. Every port in the world where jetties have been tried prove this. Besides such contraction of the mouth causes the channels of the entire river above to shoal, and when floods come the whole country becomes submerged by the river overflowing its banks, because the water cannot get away with its natural facility. Eads' damming of the mouth of the Mississippi river caused the great flood in that valley the present year, and each year the flooding will become worse and worse."

It is to us down here a matter of regret that Mr. Knapp does not state whether he knows this to be so, or if it is simply his opinion. He would be true if he were not false, and that disagreeable feature necessarily invalidates the rest of his argument.

SECRETARY TELLER has rendered a decision respecting the right of mill-owners, and residents upon mineral lands of the United States to cut wood and timber from such lands within the lines of mining claims regularly located and possessed under local laws and customs, and laws of the United States governing the location of such claims. The secretary holds that locators of mining claims, so long as they comply with the law governing their possession, are invested by congress with the exclusive right to the possession and enjoyment of all the surface included within the lines of their locations. This right amounts to property, and is capable of being enjoyed or transferred, subject to all ordinary rules governing the enjoyment of all other property. It may, consequently, be protected in the courts, and it is the duty of the possessor to care for his own if a trespass be attempted by strangers. The government having armed the locator with a complete grant of possession, he alone is concerned for its protection, and may undoubtedly maintain a suit to that end; but he can no longer, after availing himself of the exclusive right, ask the government to bring action for what is no trespass, except against such individual right of possession.

It is the opinion of the best lawyers of the state, says the Eugene City Guard, that in the event of a failure by the legislature to elect a senator there is not such a vacancy as will authorize an appointment by the governor. The constitution provides that the appointment shall be by the legislature, and the omission of that body to perform the duty cannot authorize the governor to perform it for them. Only a vacancy that occurs during a recess of the legislature, and after an election has been had, can be filled by order of the governor's appointment.

CALIFORNIANS will have their choice of four different tickets to vote at the next election, with several counties yet to hear from.

It is not at all probable, thinks the W. W. Statesman, that Washington Territory will be admitted as a state prior to 1884. The senate is a tie, with David Davis holding the casting vote, and he is more likely to refuse in our case than he is in that of Dakota. He is opposed to the annexation of northern Idaho, on the ground that it changes well-fixed geographical lines.

The extortions practiced by the Central Pacific Railroad company on California merchants has about resulted in the establishment of a new line of clipper ships to run between New York and San Francisco for freight purposes.

The model political platform reported this year is the one adopted by the Sixteenth District convention of Ohio, which nominated Colonel M. Churchill for Congress. It reads, "Resolved, that we will beat them this year."

JAS. WILLIAMS is publishing a large salmon packing establishment at Tacoma; his boats catch 1,000 salmon a night.

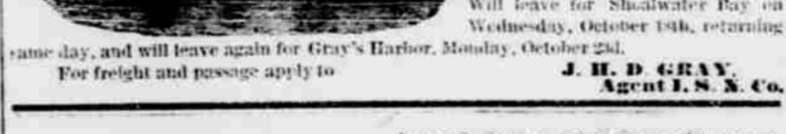
