The Senator's Views,

J. F. HALLORAN.

THE editor of The Dalles Times-Mountaineer, lately wrote to Senator-elect J. N. Dolph, asking him the following questions, which are of as much importance to us of Astoria as to the people of The Dalles:

"Ist. Do you intend to retain your position as vice-president of the O. R. & N. Co.?

2d. Would you oppose any further appropriation for the completion of the locks at the Cascades?

"3d. Are you in favor of the removal of the impediments in the Columbia river, so as to make it a highway for commerce to the seaboard?

"4. In case any matter of internal improvements should come before congress, which, seemingly might clash with the interests of the O. R. & N. or N. P. R. R. Co.s would you consider it your duty to support corporation interests rather than the people's?"

To these interrogatives, Mr. Dolph replies as follows:

"To the first question I answer No. I expect to devote my entire time and energies to the duties of my office.

To the second question I answer, that not only will I not oppose any further appropriation for the completion of the locks at the Cascades, but I shall endeavor not to be behind our present representative or any former senator or representative in congress from this state, in my efforts to procure further appropriations for the continuation of that important work.

To the third question I answer, that I believe congress has the Glass and Plated Ware. constitutional power to appropriate money for the purpose of internal improvements, and that it FRUITS AND VEGETABLES. is the duty of the general government, in the interests of commerce, to improve our rivers, lakes and harbors, and I am in favor of the removal of impediments to navigation in the Columbia river so as to make it a highway for commerce to the seaboard.

To the fourth question I answer that when I enter on the duties of senator from Oregon I shall become, if I may be permitted to use the expression, the attorney of the state, and shall endeavor to serve her with the same energy and fidelity with which I have in my Friday & Saturday Evenings. long professional career served my clients.


I shall endeavor faithfully to represent all her interests; I shall to the best of my judgment, act justly in all cases towards corporations and individuals, and upon every question which arises èndeavor to protect the rights of every section of the state and to promote alike every legitimate enterprise for the development of her resources.

My own interests and the interests of corporations and individuals shall be made secondary to the interests of the people at large. For fear some one may think the foregoing not specific, I will add that in the case mentioned in your question, I shall consider it my duty to support the people's interest; and further, that should the occasion arise when the people, demanding protection for their in . terests against the aggressions of corporations, should call on me, I should not hesitate to urge, but would gladly urge such radical measures as good judgment and a just regard for the rights of all might re-

I do not wish to be misunderstood, however. While I shall jealously watch and protect so far as I can the interests of the people, I believe that every additional facility for transportation is a direct benefit to every legitimate enterprise in the state, and that the building of the railroads which have been completed and

are in process of construction by the O. R. & N. Co., and the completion of the N. P. R. R. will prove of incalculable benefit to this state and the whole northwest, and that I should be false to the true interests of the people if I should throw any obstacle in the way of their progress."


