Concealed Weapons

The following will be a law in this state after the 1st of next February: Sec 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to carry concealed about his person in any manner whatever any revolver, pistol or other firearm, or any knife, other than an ordinary pocket knife, or any dirk or dagger, slungshot or metal knuckles, or any instrument Thos.
