A REMINISCENCE

Seven years ago to-day a party of men started from Pioche, Nevada, to go to Mineral Park, Arizona. The outfit was a representative one; there was a lawyer, a doctor, an assayer, and so on, any one of the party being possessed of protean faculties and able to turn his hand to anything that came along, from shoeing a mule to preaching a sermon. The line of march lay to the south, past the Indian reservation of St. Thomas, thence to El Dorado canyon, there crossing the Colorado, and thence to the unexplored country around Mineral park and the Hualapai mountains.
