Street Grade Notice.
NOTICE is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria, Oregon, propose to establish the grade of Cedar street at its western terminus, 28 feet above the level of grades.

Street Improvement Notice.
NOTICE is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria did on the 30th day of December, 1882, pass an ordinance, entitled "An ordinance declaring the intention of the Common Council of making certain repairs and improvements in a portion of Cedar street," the repairs and improvements to be as follows:
All of that portion of Cedar street between the east side of Salmon street and the west end of said Cedar street in that portion of said City of Astoria which was laid out and recorded by John M. Shively in Clatsop County, State of Oregon, shall be repaired and improved as hereinafter provided, and the easements thereon on the adjacent property. The said repairs and improvements shall be made by removing all of the defective piles, caps, stringers and timbers now in that portion of said Cedar street which is between the east side of Salmon street and the west side of West 9th street, and by replacing the same with new and sound fir piles, caps, stringers and timbers, and all such timbers that have been by any means, taken away or displaced, shall be also replaced with new and sound ones; all timbers so replaced to be of the same size and dimensions as those of the same kind now in the street; and said portion of said Cedar street between said east side of Salmon street and the west side of West 9th street shall be replanked over the portion and to the width it is now planked, with new and sound fir planks three inches in thickness and twelve inches wide. That portion of said Cedar street from the west side of West 9th street to the west side of West 21st street shall be repaired and improved as follows: By filling it three feet at the intersection or crossing with West 9th

street, and by excavating and lowering it three feet at the west side of the crossing of West 7th street, and by filling, grading or excavating the other portions of said street to be on a grade corresponding with such crossings when so graded and West 21st street crossing a new one, and then by planking thereon in the center the width of sixteen feet with sound fir planks not less than three inches thick and twelve inches wide, to be laid on sleepers as follows: One sleepers four inches by twelve inches shall be placed in the center of the street and shall be so leveled that the planking will rest firmly on its two sleepers four inches by twelve inches shall be placed on either side of and parallel with the center sleeper, the outer edge of the outside sleepers to be eight feet from the center of the center sleeper, the other sleepers shall be placed in the middle between the center and outside sleepers; on the sleepers and at right angles thereto the planking shall be laid each plank to be spiked to the sleepers, two spikes to each sleeper. From the west side of West 9th street to the west end of Cedar street, said repairs and improvements shall be made by constructing a new work and planking the same to the width of sixteen feet on a grade running from the west side of said West 9th street when graded, to show provided, to the top of the planking on the sidewalk at Cedar street to each by said grade, and to be graded by John M. Shively, the said new work and planking to be done as follows: Posts, 12 inches by 12 inches to be set in the center of the street and at right angles to the line of it, and distant from each other fifteen feet from center to center, on each end and in the center of each sidewalk shall be placed a post, in an upright position and of sufficient height to bring the top of the planking up to said grade; the posts shall be 12 inches in diameter and 16 inches long; upon the caps and at right angles thereto, shall be placed stringers as follows: One directly over each post and one between each corner sleeper and the center stringers, the stringers to be 4 inches by 12 inches and not less than 22 feet long, and the outside stringers shall be bolted to the caps with iron bolts as above described, and the inside stringers shall be firmly spiked to the caps. Planking not less than 3 inches thick and 12 inches wide, shall be laid on, at right angles to the stringers, and shall be spiked to each stringer, between the ends of the planks, one spike to each stringer. On either side of the roadway thus constructed, shall be placed a rail 3 by 4 inches, spiked to each post and three feet above the planking.
All of said planking, caps, stringers, nails, braces, rails and timbers to be of good sound fir timber, and the spikes shall be not less than six inches long.
A notice is hereby given that unless a remonstrance stated by the owners of two-thirds of the property fronting on said portion of said street be filed with the auditor and clerk within ten days from the final publication of this notice to-wit: Tuesday, Jan. 23, 1883, the council will proceed to make repairs and improvements to be made.
