ONE of the striking phenomena of the crisis through which Ireland is passing is the falling off in the number of Irish recruits for the army. During the first half of the century Irishmen are said to have furnished nearly if not quite seventy per cent of the British forces. The proportion has been smaller since the setting in of the tide of emigration to this country in 1847, but it has now fallen to twenty per cent., and is falling, and there is no doubt that the reason is that the political discontent has reached the enlisted class, who in bygone days did not feel it. It was, perhaps, in some degree with the view of appeasing this class that Lord Wolseley paid the high compliment to the Royal Irish Regiment at the battle of Tel-el-Kebir, but it would take a good many such compliments to do away with the effect of the attitude of the royal family toward Ireland. The sovereign, in all monarchical countries, stands in very close relations to the army, and military service cannot be very brisk in any province in which the queen and the prince are not popular, and for which they exhibit their dislike by never visiting it.

ACCORDING to a correspondent of the New York Herald the False Prophet of the Sudan has a playful way of pouring boiling tallow in the eyes of all who refuse to be converted to his way of thinking. He is an orator, and is in the habit of suddenly stopping in the midst of a harangue, fixing his eyes on vacancy, holding his breath, not winking or moving a muscle for some time. He has such skill in this species of gymnastics that he looks to be really dead, and can so remain for three or four minutes. On recovering himself he pretends to have just been on a visit to Paradise. Last year the Governor General of the Sudan heard of his doings, and sent a guard of soldiers to make him renounce the character of prophet. He turned to with his followers, slew the guard, and has since vanquished not less than 12,000 troops.

THE new penal code of New York contains a number of original features. It provides that intoxication can not be pleaded in defence of crime; that he who bribes state officers must go to the state prison for ten years and pay a fine of \$5,000; that jurors taking bribes must go to prison; that attempts at suicide must be punished by imprisonment for two years and a fine of \$1,000; that parents abandoning children under six years of age must be imprisoned for seven years; that a person whose husband or wife has been absent five successive years, and not known to be living, may marry.

PORTLAND is adopting many new ideas and engaging in many new enterprises that will redound to her success as a community; but in taking up the "call system" of dealing in grain futures she is sowing seed that will prove a disastrous crop to all concerned.

Street Improvement Notice. NOTICE is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria did on the 30th day of December, 1882, pass an ordinance, entitled "An ordinance declaring the intention of the Common Council of making certain repairs and improvements in a portion of Cedar street, the repairs and improvements to be as follows:

All of that portion of Cedar street between the east side of Salmon street and the west end of said Cedar street in that portion of said City of Astoria which was laid out and recorded by John M. Shively in Clatsop County, State of Oregon, shall be repaired and improved as hereinafter provided, and the cost thereof assessed on the adjacent property. The said repairs and improvements shall be made by removing all of the defective piles, caps, stringers and timbers now in that portion of said Cedar street which is between the east side of Salmon street and the west side of West 9th street, and by replacing the same with new and sound fir piles, caps, stringers and timbers, and all such timbers that have been by any means, taken away or displaced, shall be also replaced with new and sound ones; all timbers so replaced to be of the same size and dimensions as those of the same kind now in the street; and said portion of said Cedar street between said east side of Salmon street and the west side of West 9th street shall be repaved with the portion and to the width it is now paved, with new and sound fir planks three inches in thickness and twelve inches wide. That portion of said Cedar street from the east side of West 9th street to the west side of West 9th street shall be repaired and improved as follows: By filling it three feet at its intersection or crossing with West 9th street, and by excavating and lowering it three feet at the west side of the crossing of West 7th street, and by filling, grading or excavating the other parts or portions as to be on a grade corresponding with such crossings when so graded and West 8th street crossings as it now is, and then by planking it over in the center to the width of sixteen feet with sound fir planks not less than three inches thick and twelve inches wide, to be laid on sleepers as follows: One sleeper four inches by twelve inches shall be imbedded in the center of the street and leveled to so level that the planking will rest firmly on it; two sleepers four inches by six inches shall be placed on either side of and parallel with the center sleeper, the outer edge of the outside sleepers to be centered from the center of the center sleeper, the other sleepers shall be placed in the middle between the center and outside sleepers; on the sleepers and a right angle to the planking shall be laid each plank to be spiked to the sleepers, two spikes to each sleeper. From the west side of West 9th street to said west end of Cedar street, said repairs and improvements shall be made by constructing bent work and planking the same to the width of sixteen feet on a grade running from the west side of West 9th street to the east side of West 9th street, and by excavating and lowering it three feet at the west side of the crossing of West 7th street, and by filling, grading or excavating the other parts or portions as to be on a grade corresponding with such crossings when so graded and West 8th street crossings as it now is, and then by planking it over in the center to the width of sixteen feet with sound fir planks not less than three inches thick and twelve inches wide, to be laid on sleepers as follows: One sleeper four inches by twelve inches shall be imbedded in the center of the street and leveled to so level that the planking will rest firmly on it; two sleepers four inches by six inches shall be placed on either side of and parallel with the center sleeper, the outer edge of the outside sleepers to be centered from the center of the center sleeper, the other sleepers shall be placed in the middle between the center and outside sleepers; on the sleepers and a right angle to the planking shall be laid each plank to be spiked to the sleepers, two spikes to each sleeper. From the west side of West 9th street to said west end of Cedar street, said repairs and improvements shall be made by constructing bent work and planking the same to the width of sixteen feet on a grade running from the west side of West 9th street to the east side of West 9th street, and by excavating and lowering it three feet at the west side of the crossing of West 7th street, and by filling, grading or excavating the other parts or portions as to be on a grade corresponding with such crossings when so graded and West 8th street crossings as it now is, and then by planking it over in the center to the width of sixteen feet with sound fir planks not less than three inches thick and twelve inches wide, to be laid on sleepers as follows: One sleeper four inches by twelve inches shall be imbedded in the center of the street and leveled to so level that the planking will rest firmly on it; two sleepers four inches by six inches shall be placed on either side of and parallel with the center sleeper, the outer edge of the outside sleepers to be centered from the center of the center sleeper, the other sleepers shall be placed in the middle between the center and outside sleepers; on the sleepers and a right angle to the planking shall be laid each plank to be spiked to the sleepers, two spikes to each sleeper. From the west side of West 9th street to said west end of Cedar street, said repairs and improvements shall be made by constructing bent work and planking the same to the width of sixteen feet on a grade running from the west side of West 9th street to the east side of West 9th street, and by excavating and lowering it three feet at the west side of the crossing of West 7th street, and by filling, grading or excavating the other parts or portions as to be on a grade corresponding with such crossings when so graded and West 8th street crossings as it now is, and then by planking it over in the center to the width of sixteen feet with sound fir planks not less than three inches thick and twelve inches wide, to be laid on sleepers as follows: One sleeper four inches by twelve inches shall be imbedded in the center of the street and leveled to so level that the planking will rest firmly on it; two sleepers four inches by six inches shall be placed on either side of and parallel with the center sleeper, the outer edge of the outside sleepers to be centered from the center of the center sleeper, the other sleepers shall be placed in the middle between the center and outside sleepers; on the sleepers and a right angle to the planking shall be laid each plank to be spiked to the sleepers, two spikes to each sleeper. From the west side of West 9th street to said west end of Cedar street, said repairs and improvements shall be made by constructing bent work and planking the same to the width of sixteen feet on a grade running from the west side of West 9th street to the east side of West 9th street, and by excavating and lowering it three feet at the west side of the crossing of West 7th street, and by filling, grading or excavating the other parts or portions as to be on a grade corresponding with such crossings when so graded and West 8th street crossings as it now is, and then by planking it over in the center to the width of sixteen feet with sound fir planks not less than three inches thick and twelve inches wide, to be laid on sleepers as follows: One sleeper four inches by twelve inches shall be imbedded in the center of the street and leveled to so level that the planking will rest firmly on it; two sleepers four inches by six inches shall be placed on either side of and parallel with the center sleeper, the outer edge of the outside sleepers to be centered from the center of the center sleeper, the other sleepers shall be placed in the middle between the center and outside sleepers; on the sleepers and a right angle to the planking shall be laid each plank to be spiked to the sleepers, two spikes to each sleeper.
