United States Fish Commissioner, Washington, D. C.
From Astoria, Or., Columbia River, For London Exhibition.
The fact that the salmon is sent from the Columbia river should be made especially prominent. These packages will be forwarded by Wells, Fargo & Co., to Washington.
WORKMEN are getting out timbers for the construction of an extensive floating cannery and fish oil refinery, it will be 140 feet long, with a 32 feet beam and a depth of hold 8 feet amidship and 9 feet forward and aft. Powerful machinery to propel the craft and capacious tanks and retorts for use in refining the oil and cooking the fish are already built. The vessel will be launched and ready for action by April and will make her first foray among the oolachane on the northwest coast.

It is with regret we learn from the *Northwest News* that the "plains of existence are desolate with forsaken camps, and the vain pursuit of seeing and changing goals has tracked the drifting sands until the winds sigh and the waters sweep to the sad threnodies of broken hearts."
