THE LOST STEAMER

EMPIRE CITY, Or., Feb. 6.—Capt. Korts, with his officers and crew, of the lost steamer Tacoma, arrived here this morning, and upon being interviewed in regard to the loss of his ship, he utterly refused to make any statement in regard to the disaster for publication. Capt. Korts speaks in terms of the highest praise of the conduct of his officers and men during the trying times and dangers through which they had passed. He also speaks in the very highest terms of the conduct of the people of Gardiner and vicinity for help rendered in saving the lives of the men on the wreck, and their kindness to them after their rescue, they being in a destitute condition. The wreck was sold yesterday for \$500 to A. T. Steinberger, one of the passengers on the Tacoma. The number of officers and men that arrived here to-day from the wrecked Tacoma is 38. Chief Engineer Wilson, and Wells and Steinberger, the two passengers, have gone to Portland.

The New York Sun in January, 1843, predicted the state of this country in forty years. It said there would be ten new states with Oregon settlements extending to the Rocky mountains and a considerable population in Oregon. As a matter of fact there have been eight new states added, including Oregon and not including West Virginia. The population was put at 90,000,000, whereas it is only 55,000,000. The passage to England, it said, would be made in four or five days, the fare not exceeding \$20; the passage has been made in little more than six days, and even steamer fare is not quite so low as the Sun put it. The population of New York City was put at 1,000,000. It is 2,000,000 more than that. The capital would be removed to some city in the Mississippi valley and the national building at Washington be used as a national university. The China trade would be carried on by immense steamships across the Pacific ocean and up the Oregon river and across the mountains by a railroad, and so down the Mississippi to St. Louis, "the probable great center of trade."

From a special from Cheyenne and Arapahoe agency in the Indian Territory, it is learned that eastern capitalists and stock men have leased from the Cheyenne and Arapahoe Indian agency 500,000 acres of grass land from each of the tribes, with the privilege of fencing the same and erecting necessary ranch buildings and improvements. The leases will have to be approved by the secretary of the interior before going into effect, but no difficulty is anticipated, as the Indians are unanimous in the matter.

The Northern Pacific extension from Portland to Kalama will require 475,000 cubic yards of excavation, 45,000 yards of rock work, about three miles of trestle, one short truss bridge over Miller creek, and 270 acres of clearing. Its cost will approximate \$1,000,000. It is expected that the link will be finished and ready for traffic about the middle of next November. Inclines will be built at Kalama and at the terminus of the Portland branch on the opposite side of the Columbia, and cars will be transferred by an iron ferry boat, now in course of construction in New York, under the supervision of Chief Engineer Henderson. It will be shipped in sections, by rail or ocean, and put together at Portland. Its capacity will be twenty cars.
