

Captain Forbes states that it will only be necessary to see that the compartments of the two lower decks are without defect, and to introduce a complete system of pumps for air and water, and to adopt the old Chinese method of packing silks and teas, using either casks or metallic coverings so far as practicable. The hazards of an ocean voyage, he says, will be reduced to a minimum; but no safety can be guaranteed where steamers run ashore, as too often happens .- Iron.


