"Pioneers of Revolution."

A CHICAGO paper considers a circular sent to it worthy a leader. The document comes from San Francisco, is "a blood-curdling" affair with mysterious diagrams, skull and cross-bones and insignia of insanity, and purports to be issued by "We, the mechanics, skilled workmen and wagon-workers of San Francisco, the pioneers of revolution, the men who have produced all the real wealth this city owns."

THE San Francisco receipts for potatoes for the last eight months are 690,381 sacks, against 831,397 sacks during the preceding twelve months.
