Latest London advices say: What is of chief importance at the moment is the outlook for the trade in preserved salmon during the next few months. The Glengarry has just arafter the style of an overland railroad rived here with 26,359 cases from Astoria. This makes the total arrivals of Columbia river fish in the United Kingdom, for the present season equal to about 300,000 cases, and, so far as can be ascertained, not more than 60,000 cases are expected to arrive between now and May next. Of course, it must not be forgotten that there are heavy consignments of Frazer river salmon yet to come forward, but these are well known by the trade as not being of the most desirable character, and though easier terms may be accepted as the year rolls on, sales are not likel, to be effected with much facility while any quantity of Columbia salmon (which is preferred) remains on hand.
