It is usual to have white frosts a forerunner of rain, but this season, though the ground glitters with frost in the early morning in the interior, yet the days continue cloudless. In California it assumes the formidable appearance of a drought, and grave fears are expressed in regard to the possibility of a crop. Here, in Oregon, such a thing as the failure of a crop for want of rain is unknown. The present season of drought in our sister state will have a tendency as far as the lumber interest is concerned, to check the demand which the Sound mills and that at Knappton can not supply.
