That the next, wheat crop of Oregon and Washington will be larger by 25 per cent. than any previous one, seems now to be assured. A good fall of snow in castern Oregon and Washington covered the grain fields for some time and shielded the growing plant from the disastrous effect of the extreme cold. Moistnre enough has remained in the ground during the past month of pleasant weather to give it a vigorous start on the road to maturity, and farmers feel jubilant at the prospect. In the Wilamette valley little wheat was spared by the biting frost; but the weeds were also killed, and the ground heaved up and so thoroughly mellowed that many farmers who were intending to summer fallow declare that nature has performed the work so well that they will seed the ground to wheat instead. By the latest estimates the acreage of wheat in the valley will be at least 25 per cent. larger than last year, and the yield per acre be largely increased .- Commercial Herald.
