Street Grade Notice.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Common Council of the City of Astoria intend to establish the grade of Arch street, in Shively's Astoria, in Clatsop County, Oregon, from West-6th street to the west end of Arch street, the grade to be as follows: At the intersection with West-6th street, 120 feet; at West-7th street, 116 feet; at West-8th street, 124 feet; at West-9th street, 120 feet; and at the west end of Arch street, 108 feet above the base of grades, as established by ordinance No. 71, of said City, and unless a remonstrance signed by the owners of two-thirds of the property adjacent to said part of said Arch street, be filed with the Auditor and Clerk of said city within ten days from the final publication of this notice, namely, on or before April 21st, 1883, said grade will be established. And notice is also hereby given that said Common Council propose to improve said part of Arch street by grading the same to its full width and to said proposed grade, and by constructing side walks six feet wide on each side thereof, and unless a like remonstrance against said improvement be filed with said Auditor and Clerk within said time, said Common Council will order said improvement to be made.
