The Coming Issue.

The issue in the next presidential campaign, says the Republican Newark Advertiser, must be on the Republican side a stout defense of the theory and practice of protection.

The Cincinnati Gazette, another republican paper says when we allow that free trade is beneficial over a continent 5,000 miles across and 2,000 miles up and down, we put into the hands of the free-traders an argument which they use with destructive effect.

The internal trade is more than ten times the foreign trade. When we protest against this, and let that go free, we cling to the tail after we have let go the hide.

If it is a constitutional principle, how can we oppose free trade with Canada? The vain sentiment of pride in territorial bigness must not be permitted to impoverish us by a beautiful trade.

Nor is a division of the nation absolutely necessary to the higher application of the protective principle; for by the rescinding of a restrictive clause in the constitution the several states may multiply their wealth by protecting against one another, while holding to the political union for the general defense.

A Good Man Gone. PETER COOPER died in New York City last Wednesday, at the advanced age of ninety-two. During his long life he was a living exemplification of what industry, courage and perseverance can accomplish.

He made a vast amount of money and wisely bestowed considerable of it in judicious aid to his fellow citizens. He was a genius, and built the first locomotive engine in America, fifty years ago.

For half a century his name has been prominent for goodness and generosity, for courage and mental activity, and probably no man could have died that will meet with more universal and well-deserved panegyric than the great and good man who closed a well spent life last Wednesday.
