Heavy Financing. The New York Sunday Mercury of the 2d says: The news that Endicott of Boston was about to run an Oregon transcontinental reached the ears of D. O. Mills on Thursday, and he marketed 5,000 shares while Endicott was writing his orders. This Northern Pacific system embraces \$350,000,000 in stocks and bonds, and could John Law or the Duke of Orleans wake up they would appreciate the insignificance of their financing compared to that of Mr. Villard. Fifty years from now this capitalization may be warranted by the increased value of their lands, but we are told by those who know that the sale announced of \$10,000,000 worth of land to an English syndicate has no foundation in fact. C. P. Huntington during the week has sold all the Central Pacific he could without utterly demoralizing the stock. The Southern Pacific will soon be a powerful rival of this road, and the owners are selling out and investing in Southern Pacific. There is quite a scare among the holders of Central Pacific stock, as in case the Government should compel the payment of the security, each holder of 100 shares of stock will be liable to an assessment of \$25 a share, as only 75 per cent. has been paid in, and will also be personally liable to the par value of the stock. The consequence is that a large number of certificates have, during the last fortnight been transferred to straw names. Union Pacific was also sickly during the week, owing to a prospect of a cut in tariff rates by the Denver road, which will soon be completed to Ogden, and with it the Baltimore and Ohio will thus cut off a large portion of the Union Pacific traffic.

Going Ahead. A WASHINGTON special says that the Nicaragua canal company, tired of waiting for action by congress, and alarmed by the activity manifested by the Panama company, is taking active steps for beginning work on the proposed canal. The financial managers have been working quietly in New York and other money centers, and have made such favorable progress that they will be able to begin operations in Nicaragua as soon as the season is over. Menocal, the engineer who surveyed the routes for both canals, and who represented the American government at the canal conference at Paris is now at the Washington navy yard. His views on the subject have not changed, and he is earnestly favoring the Nicaragua route, so much so that he is an active member of the company which is preparing to undertake the work, and is to take personal supervision of operations there, when begun. He confirms the report that the managers of the company are determined to go on; \$45,000,000 is his estimate of the cost.

Pointers. The New Orleans Picayune defines a complimentary vote as something that is thrown at a man to make him feel bad because he is not quite popular enough to be elected.

Of the 140 members retired from the last congress, 100 are applicants for a Federal appointment. One of the "lame-duck" members, in eloquently pleading for a place, said: "I must have a place; I cannot earn my living without one."

There is great competition for the location of the new capital city for Dakota, and the talk is that the commissioners will come out of the contest with money enough to enable them to retire from political life and calmly "face the storm of mankind." A dispatch from Moscow states that a large mine has been discovered, connecting with the Kremlin, where the coronation of the czar is to take place. The telegrams also state that a request has been wired to St. Petersburg for 100 men to be sent at once to Moscow for the purpose of destroying the mine. England is excited over the arrest at London and Birmingham last Thursday, of men who had in

their possession enough dynamite and other explosives to blow the kingdom to atoms, and who evidently intended to use it if they got a chance.

A Chicago journal says that a printer has been cured by prayer, which leads a Texas paper to say "if he was cured of extracting the word in a paragraph on which a joke hinges and substituting a word of his own 'to make sense,' as he puts it, we will endorse the prayer cure and give it a five-inch electro ad. free, one year, top column, next to reading matter."

Chief Justice Carter, of the supreme court of the District of Columbia, the other day interrupted a lawyer who was saying that "the making of his will is one of the most noble acts of a man's life." Mr. Carter spoke up in dissent, urging that will-making is a disagreeable job to most men. He concluded in this way: "If a man could take his possessions with him, all the property of the earth would now be either in heaven or hell."

As evidence of what a determined woman can do, it is related that the daughter of a once wealthy Bostonian being reduced to the necessity of providing for herself, conceived the idea of putting up pickles and preserves for the market. She made her intention known to intimate friends, and they promised to become her customers. There was no difficulty in selling all that she could prepare with her own hands. The business increased, and grew to magnificent proportions within the third year. Now she is reaping a net profit of \$10,000 a year.

Consul Francis, of Victoria, B. C., reports to the state department that the twenty salmon canneries of that province aggregated, for the season of 1882, 235,000 cases, valued at \$1,175,000. Over 9,000 cases were sent to Canada and Australia, via San Francisco. Francis says the salmon business on the coast of British Columbia and Alaska territory can be prosecuted with profit to almost an unlimited extent. It is established beyond a doubt that the coast of Alaska, should canned or packed salmon meet in the future a considerable demand in the states, could supply the same from this one of its inexhaustible resources.

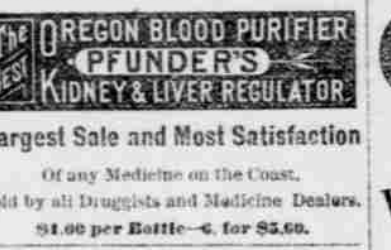
