Two thousand more men are en route, and the whole Hungarian colony at Bukowina, numbering 20,000 souls have determined to leave the place, owing to the insufficiency of crops to feed the population.

"I fine you \$10," said an Arkansas Justice of the Peace to a man who had been convicted of a misdemeanor. "I haven't the exact change Judge," replied the victim, throwing down a \$20 gold piece. "That's correct," said the Judge, sweeping the money from the table. "This court reserves the right to raise or lower the fine, and on this occasion it is advisable to raise."

The effects of the drug are described as sedative, gently narcotic, and, in larger doses, not unlike alcohol. It would be interesting to know how soon a "nitro-glycerine habit" will be added to the increasing varieties of drug enslavement.

The boy shot the unhappy parent, but it was arranged that the younger girl should acknowledge the crime, on a plea of self-defense, so that her extreme youth might save her. The whole affair was arranged and carried out with a coolness worthy of veteran criminals.

English and American Financier. It is not generally known, says the Globe-Democrat, that the British government machine for collecting and disbursing revenue handles just about the same amount of money every year as our own. The treasury departments of the two countries, in other words, are of about equal importance. The British government raises a few million dollars more by taxation every year than the government of the United States, but only a few millions; and, on the other hand, it does not disburse very much more money than our treasury department, in spite of the expensiveness of British royalty, and the British military and naval establishments.

The fiscal year of the United States ends June 30; that of Great Britain March 31. The following table shows at a glance in round numbers the receipts and expenditures of the two governments during the last full year under each:

The real significance of these figures, however, does not appear, unless it is borne in mind that \$166,200,000 of the total expenditures by the United States was for the reduction of the public debt, while only \$35,500,000 was applied by Great Britain to debt reduction. The expenditures of Great Britain, exclusive of payments on the principal of the debt, amounted to \$409,000,000, but the ordinary expenditures of the United States reached only \$258,000,000. So, after all, our government is comparatively very much less expensive than the bare totals of the fiscal operations of the two countries would indicate.
