The Railroad Bridge.

The bridge across the Willamette river, referred to by Mr. Villard in his speech at New Market theater Wednesday, will be 1,186 feet long, not including the trestle approaches, and the grade will be sixteen feet above high water mark. It will have two tracks and will be as substantial as any structure of the kind in the United States. There will be three spans, each 264 feet long, one east and two west of the draw span, which will be 394 feet long. This gives a clear space of 197 feet on either side of the pivotal pier. The east end of the bridge will be at the upper part of the terminal grounds in Albina and a few hundred feet below the old warehouse. The Portland end will be at the foot of Sixteenth street, or to be more particular, at the point where Sixteenth street would intersect the river if extended to the shore. Borings are now being made to determine the exact nature of the foundation to be put in. These borings are carried to the depth of eighty feet below the river bed.

There are communities of negroes, in places like the Sea Islands, who are wholly without religion or secular education, and are degenerating in barbarism and vice; and there are neighborhoods in which the poor whites have by no means saved themselves from poverty, ignorance and degradation. Progress at the south is confined to populous points.
