Villard's Regrets.

AT Walla Walla, Villard in his customary talk told them that he regretted very much that the advocates of the Oregon Short Line would be disappointed:

"The Cascade branch of the Northern Pacific has received a great deal of consideration by the newspapers. The engineers have seek them. To build the road it will cost \$8,000,000. The day before I shipwreck of everything else they left Portland the engineers re ported that the most favorable grade would be 50 feet to the mile, which would enable one engine to haul twenty loaded cars; but this would require a tunnel 17,000 feet in length, over three miles, to cost 2,000,000, and take three years to build it. Notwithstanding that this appears like a stupendous undertaking we will commence the construction of the road from both ends this summer. We want to reach the Yakıma country and the base of the mountains on the other side as soon as possible, as we cannot commence the construction of the tunnel until its approaches are nearly completed. This will involve a long delay. But before the tunnel is done we expect to have so reduced freights that you will not care a cent whether your grain goes over the line or down the Columbia river."


