Some few come here forgetful of the fact that wherever one goes he takes himself along; that no change of climate or scenery or surroundings can change his characteristics; that if he is idle and profligate he will go to the bad about as quickly here as elsewhere. Indeed it were worse for one who thinks "the world owes me a living" to try to build his life on that text in Oregon, for people in a new country like this are apt to be impatient with such a fallacy, and elbow the utterer one side. 
