The Abbe Marteau is dead, and

who was the Abbe Marteau? ask

all France. No French soldier ever had more resolute or sublime courage than he. He was Vicar of Vaux Vilaine, in the Marne Department. The Department was occupied by the Prussians during the war of 1866. A Prussian officer was assassinated in the parish of the priest, and as the assassin could not be found, two innocent inhabitants of the place were, in accordance with military usage selected to suffer death as something of an expiation for the murder. They were about to be executed—had made their prepar- THROAT, LUNGS AND CHEST. ations for the fatal shots-when the brave Abbe intervened, and offered his life in exchange for the release of the two enforced hostages. And there was no braggadocia in the act. His offer was accepted by the authorities, and he, in turn, prepared himself for the fatal aim of the executioners. As his last hour apparently drew uncomfortably near, he had administered to him the final rites of his church. He was led out to Notice of Application to Purchase the place of execution, his eyes were bandaged after they had seen the squad of armed soldiers before him, he did not falter, and then the selected executioners themselves consulted before sending to his grave an innocent man. They sent a message to headquarters, and in due time had the satisfaction of receiving from the superior authorities an order countermanding the execution. France and Germany both applauded the selfsacrificing spirit of the noble Abbe, the press of the latter country being particularly generous in its praises of his self-sacrificing spirit. He out-lived the terrible ordeal seventeen years, and has now been buried with civic honors as well as religious ceremonies.—S. F. Bulletin.


